

Perse Exam Results



We were delighted to see many former Pelican pupils do so well in their GCSE, A level and Pre U exams this year. Once again at both GCSE and A level The Perse was the top performing school or college in the East of England.

The A level results were the best ever with an outstanding 55% of exam entries being graded A* (or Pre U/IB equivalent) and 87% A*-A. This meant the overwhelming majority of Perse pupils progressed to their first choice university, and The Perse was placed second in the national league table of independent schools A level/PreU/IB performance by the Times and the Telegraph.
