With Julia Halbert retiring at the end of this term, I would like to announce that we have appointed **Eleanor Lowe** as the **Head of Learning Support for the Pelican and Prep**, to start in September. Eleanor is currently Head of Learning Support and a Year 6 Class Teacher at St Mary's Junior School, Cambridge where she has been teaching for the past four years. She has a Psychology degree from the University of Liverpool, a PGCE from Homerton, University of Cambridge, and was recently awarded a Distinction for her National Award for SEN Coordination (NASENCo) from UCL. 3-18 School Calendar

Events are available to view in the new online 3-18 School Calendar and can be viewed via the School website here. The new calendar is intuitive and easy to use, and can be synced with personal calendars via the ParentPortal.



The calendar incorporates sports fixtures alongside all other calendar entries,



allowing users to **filter calendar** entries by year group and category e.g. Year 3 Parents' Evenings / productions / events.

To navigate to a specific date or change the view (day, week, month, list/grid), click on the options on the left-hand side of the screen.

Uniform

As the weather becomes warmer, the summer dress might become an option for some children. These are now available to purchase online from Mr Cricket, as are the new black backpacks. However, the current blue backpacks are absolutely fine for children to keep using indefinitely. A reminder that all Prep and Pelican branded uniform is now sourced from Mr Cricket, and not from John Lewis.

Sunscreen, Headwear and Water

We recommend that parents oversee the application of long-lasting sunscreen at the start of the day. If sending sunscreen into school for your child, please ensure it is labelled. Staff are not able to provide or apply sunscreen, and children are not allowed to share sunscreen due to the risk of allergy. If children do not wear sunscreen in sunny conditions, they will be asked to cover themselves appropriately or relocate to a shaded area and not take part in the activity. School staff taking outdoor activities are responsible for:



- Checking that pupils have applied sun protection and reminding to re-apply this at regular intervals.
- Ensuring that pupils are reminded to use shaded (or indoor) space when relevant.
- Ensuring that plenty of water is provided and made accessible to students.
- Being vigilant for signs of effect from the elements.



Children need a suitable hat or cap which should be Perse branded and can be purchased from Mr Cricket.
