Activities Week – Monday 6th – Friday 9th June

Summer Concerts – Monday 12th and Tuesday 13th June

Every child will be involved in one of the upcoming concerts at the Peter Hall Performing Arts Centre at the Upper. For Years 3&4 this will be from 6-6.45pm on Monday 12th June with a range of junior ensembles and finishing with everyone on stage for a choral finale. Years 5&6 have their turn on Tuesday 13th June with a first half (6-6.50pm) consisting of senior ensembles. The second half (7.10 – 8pm) will consist of more ensembles and climax with every child on stage for a choral finale. Refreshments will be available from 5.30pm onwards, and also at the interval on Tuesday.

Sports Day – Friday 30th June

Advance warning of our Sports Day, which starts at 1pm on the final Friday of term. The fields at Porson Road will be open for parking and picnics from 12pm onwards. There will be four activities (one for each year group) happening simultaneously – 75/100m, 300/400m, ball throw and tug-o-war and every child will be involved in each event. PSHE 'Life Bus'

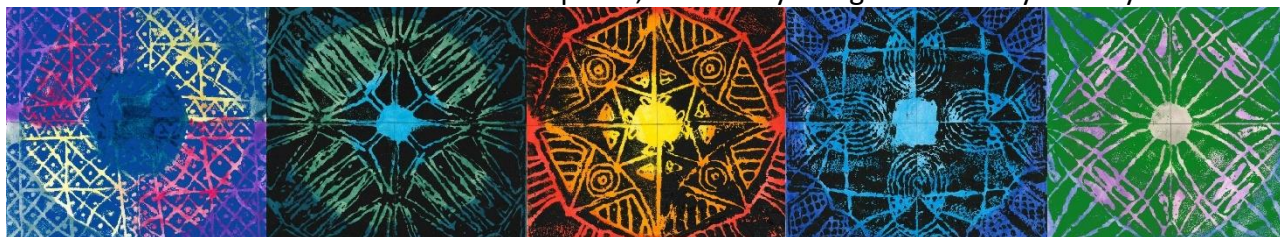
As part of our PSHE curriculum, a mobile classroom from the Cambridge and Peterborough Life Education Centre will be visiting on 7th and 8th June for Year 3 and Year 5 during Activity Week. All these children will have a lesson in their high-tech classroom, appropriate to their age and understanding and will be developing the necessary skills, knowledge and understanding about the human body in order for them to make healthy choices. Year 3 will look at "It's great to be me" (how organs work together as systems inside the body, and personal safety and behaviour). Year 5 will look at "Decisions" (peer influences and group dynamics, and the effects of drugs on the organs and systems of the body). If parents are interested to see this for themselves, there are spaces to come for a 20-minute presentation on the Thursday (8th June) morning from 8.30 – 8.50am.
