### **Housepoint Trophies**

The half term Routledge House Trophy for housepoints was awarded today, with Barbarians coming out on top. Full results as follows: 1<sup>st</sup>: Barbarians (1,744), 2<sup>nd</sup>: Nomads (1,654), 3<sup>rd</sup>: Corinthians (1,631), 4<sup>th</sup>: Foresters (1,630). **Archie Barker** collected this as the highest scoring Year 6 Barbarian this half term.

The Cooper Inter-House Trophy was also awarded today, which took account of every single housepoint awarded over the course of the past three terms. Congratulations to 1<sup>st</sup>: Foresters (16,326), 2<sup>nd</sup>: Nomads: (16,080), 3<sup>rd</sup>: Barbarians (16,008), 4<sup>th</sup>: Corinthians (15,878). **Mia Bird** and **Ivy Chen** collected this as the highest scoring Year 6 Foresters of the year. This means that a staggering 64,292 housepoints have been awarded over the course of the year (an average of 227 per child)!

### International House Trophy

Mr Bown was able to award the Globe Trophy to Nomads in Singapore during his visit last week. Combined scores for this term are as follows: 1<sup>st</sup>: Nomads (5,645), 2<sup>nd</sup>: Barbarians (5,551), 3<sup>rd</sup>: Foresters (5,110), 4<sup>th</sup>: Corinthians (4,598). **Cara Mannion** and **Noah Higham-Lee**, House Elders for Nomads, collected the award.

### Year 6 Perse Independent Study Homework Exhibition

Tuesday morning saw the second Year 6 Independent Study Homework Exhibition in the Hall. The children have been working on a variety of personal projects this term for one of their weekly homework slots, exploring their personal passions and interests. 45 of the children were keen to become exhibitors, sharing what they had been working on, explaining their process and outcomes to others in their year group. The rest of Year 6 then attended the exhibition as visitors, learning about diverse projects such as a how to grow your own vegetables; write a screenplay in the style of Steven Spielberg; knit a rug; create a camera obscura; make a working motor; build a model of Cambridge or plan a trip around Canada's must visit spots! The children evaluated their learning, commenting they had developed a number of crucial skills including time management, effective research, independence, creativity, initiative, perseverance and public speaking.

#### Rocketman!

This morning we held the finals of the Activities Week Rocket Competition with the 12 Form representatives battling it out in front of the whole school! Very well done to all the children who took part with some very inventive rockets, many of which were beautifully designed and amusingly named. Congratulations to Andy Ren whose rocket travelled furthest with a new school record of 76.3m, ahead of Eddie Carter (60.1m) and Elizabeth Kennedy (59.5m).

He led after two jumps but his distance of 4.46m was pipped by 8cm in the final round.





### Quiz – National Finals

Well done to our Quiz team of Eunice Stewart-Wallace, Steven Wang, Anneliese Heck and Shashwat Sharma who came third in the country in the Prep School finals this week, held at Oxford University. My thanks to Will Bidwell and Cat Andrews for their support and work over the course of the year. Forty teams battled it out in the finals, having qualified from two previous qualifying rounds, with 832 teams taking part from 503 schools. Questions were on topics as diverse as: Which of the following flags does not feature a bird in its design (Dominica, Venezuela, Mexico, Egypt)? And how many spikes does Bart Simpson have on his head (15, 9, 4, 5)?



### *Myths & Legends* House Activity Day

Children enjoyed a literal all-singing and all-dancing Myths & Legends House Activity Day yesterday, organised by Cat Andrews. Activities included a Greek Olympics (evading Charybdis, Cerberus and Polyphemus whilst hopping like Achilles or balancing the world like Atlas) and Roman Mosaic Making, a Global Mythology Quiz, Storytelling (Japanese, Australian and North American myths) and a showcase of dances from world mythology (Viking, Polynesian, Amazonian and Egyptian). The finale in front of the whole school even included a staff mash-up of all the dances, featuring Julia Halbert being dragged front and centre... Many thanks to all the staff who helped to make this a very special way to end the year and especially Cat Andrews for masterminding this in immense detail on her last full day at the Prep!

#### PODcast

POD, our School Council, have produced their final PODcast of the year here. Many thanks to Mr Reston for overseeing the process (and Mr Bown for his slick radio skills!) but special thanks to all the children as POD is one of the main formal ways of listening to the pupil voice. Two of our Year 6 reps, Ellie Cope and Nandika **Prasad**, give an update of Pupil Organised Democracy activity over the course of the past year.

### Sport

Well done to all the children and coaches for their hard work and enthusiasm in sport across a stellar year, and for creating so many special memories with friends. In total, across Years 3, 4 and 5, there have been 565 fixtures played this year. The Prep have won a staggering 75%, drawn 8% and lost 17%. For cricket, the Prep has won 81% of their fixtures, with 2% drawn and 17% lost.

Significant time and energy goes into providing sporting opportunities for all children and I am grateful to Ed McGregor for his tireless energy in organising so many fixtures for all children, as well as encouraging opportunities for some of our most elite sports players to perform on a regional and national stage. This year we had national champions with our Boys' Hockey side, Girls' Tennis, Boys' Tennis, Girls' Table Tennis and we had a Runner Up in Boys' Long Jump. All of these winners feature in this photo. We wish our Boys' Cricket side all the best in their National Finals today.

### School Office




