Assemblies

Assemblies provide a valuable opportunity for the whole school community to gather together. Parents are very welcome to attend on a Friday (8.40 to shortly after 9.00am) when we celebrate special efforts and achievements both in and out of school, hear moral messages, sing, listen to musicians and finish with *Scores on the Doors*!

Tuesday assemblies are usually led by me but sometimes we have a guest speaker. During the course of the year we also include Form Assemblies for every child; these are low-key events (no parents!) where children present a particular theme of interest and can get practice at performing on stage in front of the whole school. My thanks to Jo Coleman's 6Alpha who opened our Form Assembly series with a nod to Harvest and the importance of water as a commodity in the global food chain before managing to tempt us with delicacies from around the world!

Thursday assemblies are usually led by a member of the Senior Leadership Team but with the occasional guest speaker. My thanks to Eleanor Lowe this week who acknowledged Dyslexia Awareness Week with a memorable presentation which included various challenges, a study of left and right brain thinking, and a <u>video</u> about how to see dyslexia differently.

Assemblies will cover a range of messages and will also aim to touch on some of the key moments from various world religions. Online learning

The school has a number of online subscriptions available which can enhance learning at home:

Typing: Typing Club (which should be familiar to Year 5 as they are currently using it for weekly homework) is a great platform for developing typing skills. It can be accessed via https://the-perse.typingclub.com. If children are unsure of how to log in, their Computing teacher can confirm their username and password.

Maths: *MangaHigh* is a fun and interactive way to develop maths skills, either through tasks assigned by the teacher or just general practice. This can be accessed by visiting www.mangahigh.com, logging in with the user ID and password noted in their planners. We also make use of the activities on *Maths Frame* via www.mathsframe.co.uk (login details shared with children upon first use).

French: For improving knowledge and understanding of French vocabulary, children can log into *Linguascope*, via www.linguascope.com, using the login details they have in their planners.

Current Affairs: Children also have access to the digital newspaper *First News* by visiting https://schools.firstnews.co.uk. Year 6 should already be familiar with this as it is one of the main sources we have suggested (as part of our Year 6 homework timetable) for developing their awareness of current affairs throughout the week.

Charity Vote – Marine Conservation Society UK

Many thanks to all the children who nominated charities for the recent Big Vote. After Mr Reston's informative presentation on each charity, with support from Fenella Clarke and Alissa Devereux (Upper 6th Form Charities Committee), children and some of the staff marked their ballot papers. Piano and violin continue to be popular instruments at this age. We are always eager to promote all instruments and are particularly keen to encourage some of the less mainstream instruments, all of which enable the orchestral opportunities which play a large part in the musical life at the Prep and Upper.
