Dear Parents,

We have spent the week thinking about the theme of this year's Anti-Bullying campaign of *Make a Noise About Bullying*. I am hugely grateful to Laura Robertson for leading a range of initiatives this week and to the children for responding so well as they learn about making a noise and standing up for what is right. I loved the children's imaginative wish list of superpowers to help them deal with bullying:

Freeze – to freeze the moment of bullying and rewind the clock Aquapower – to wash away bullying

Mind control - to control the bully's mind so they don't do it

Invisibility – to sneak up and shout "Stop!" in the bully' ear Click my fingers – and make the bully calm

The children wore their wacky socks today to highlight variety, difference, uniqueness and diversity. They have also been able to showcase their original art designs with the following two large scale art collaborations kindly put together by Laura and Sally Matthews. I am also grateful to Lucy van Gasse, our singing teacher, and her two choirs who added to the same messaging with Year 3&4 singing *You Raise Me Up* and Year 5&6 singing *You Will Be Found*.



Continuing the theme of 'kindness', my thanks to all those families who sent in Christmas shoeboxes (120 in total) which have been sent off to disadvantaged families in Eastern Europe. A special mention should go to Corinthians for being the House to contribute the highest number.

As well as looking Anti-Bullying, assemblies have recently covered Guy Fawkes and Bonfire Night (confidently presented by 3Alpha), Concussion Awareness (Ed McGregor) and a presentation from the Marine Conservation Society, the children's chosen charity for this year.

This week has seen the start of our full programme of girls' football, with fixtures for everyone in Years 4, 5 and 6 and plenty of goals being scored by the Prep. However, the first ever goals to be scored by girls at the Prep were in 2014 by Beatrice Rogers, May Busher and Bella Harvey (all currently in the U6 at the Upper) who were drafted into an U9 boys' team and promptly responded with four goals apiece in a 12-1 defeat of a local rival! We were delighted that Beatrice, currently starring for Cambridge United Women's XI, returned to the Prep this week to talk to our U11 teams and referee one of the fixtures.



My thanks to the Year 6 volunteers and all staff who were in school last weekend for the Year 2 Taster Morning. Over fifty children from primary and pre-prep schools attended. The incoming Pelican cohort will have separate familiarisation events. Finally, best wishes to our musicians who are sitting exams next week.

3-18 Digital Strategy – 1:1 devices

Today parents in Years 4, 5 and 6 will receive a PersePost which provides some details of our 3-18 digital strategy going forwards, with 1:1 devices being introduced into Years 6 & 8 in September 2024, with Years 5 & 7 following a year later. Children in these four years will retain pen, paper and books but teachers will be able to integrate these devices into their learning where most optimal and in a 'digital blend' approach. This will prepare students for a more immersive digital workflow on advanced devices from Year 9 onwards. Significant research, reading, courses, school visits, thinking and discussion have gone into the planning for this over the last few years as we look to ensure that every child retains the best of our existing curriculum as well as being prepared for a future way of working. This work has been led by Tobias Bown (our Assistant Head Academic) as well as Paul Baker (Head of Digital Strategy 3-18) and Fraser Robertson (Director of IT 3-18). Further details, guides and training (for children and parents) will be provided as they are rolled out.
