
PPP Christmas Fair - Wednesday 13 December

Absence from Games

We expect that if a child is well enough to be in School, they will be well enough to participate in a Games session — the School sports kit has been chosen to ensure children are comfortable and warm whilst participating in Games activities. Children should not leave School if they cannot participate in Games but will be kept occupied and supervised until the end of the school day.

Music Individual Tuition

The Perse would like to reiterate to parents that individual peripatetic music teachers (peris) are engaged by the School on a self-employed basis. Parents enter into a contract for individual music lessons at the School directly with the peri, not with the School. This is an important distinction for HMRC tax reasons. For this reason, any paperwork sent out to parents from the peris will not include the Perse address or crest. Progress updates are provided by the peri directly to the parent; these can happen via the music practice book, email, phone calls or in a face to face meeting organised with each individual peri.
