Amidst the cold, grey and wet pre-Spring weather, I hope you find that this week's bumper newsletter shines a warm glow on what makes the Prep such a special place, capturing the essence of a Perse education as we enrich and excite the bright minds of the children in our care.

My thanks to our Librarian Ros West, assisted by Jo Fenna, for organising the visit of award-winning author <u>Lisa Thompson</u> and the collection of over 400 donated books to go to Nepal, and to 5Aleph for their form assembly introducing World Book Day. All of this was preceded with even more costumes for the Year 5 Medieval History Day, organised by Annelise Sanders, and also our Year 3 & 4 Ballet Showcase.

Yesterday saw the whole school celebration of our public speaking challenge, run by Raph de Albuquerque. Every child took part, tasked to speak about a world-changing and innovative invention of their choice. Across


The Wind in the Willows – Year 6 Musical – 19, 20, 21 March

Giving Notice for the end of the Summer Term

Parents are required to give one term's notice of any pupil withdrawal. If you intend to withdraw your child from The Perse at the end of this academic year, then you must write to the Head to give formal notice by the first day of the Summer Term (Monday 15 April). If you haven't informed the School already, a term's notice in writing is also required for pupils who are leaving The Perse to go elsewhere at the end of Year 6. This applies also for those pupils who have already accepted a transfer place at the Upper School but will not be taking up this place. Parents giving notice after the deadline will be liable for the Michaelmas term's fees in lieu of notice, as the School will have committed to Michaelmas Term expenditure on the assumption that pupils were staying.

Prep School Uniform Reminder

Trousers, shorts, skirts, pullovers, cardigans and socks can be sourced from any supplier but must be plain. All branded items of uniform* are sourced at MR Cricket Hockey (either instore at The Old Blacksmith's Yard, Burwell CB25 0EA or online at www.perseschoolkit.co.uk). A free delivery service is offered to the Prep every Tuesday for items ordered by the previous Sunday.

The PPP (Perse Prep Parents) sell second-hand uniform via two uniform sales per year, but specific requests for items can be made by contacting Mrs Johnson at 2ndhanduniformppp@gmail.com.

All items of uniform and sports kit must be named (name tapes, permanent markers/sharpies or stickers). Please name on the inside of clothing (collar or rear waist band). MR Cricket Hockey offer a labelling service.

Everyday Uniform List

School blazer*

White crested polo shirt*

Grey V-necked pullover, or cardigan

Plain dark grey trousers, shorts, skirt or grey box pleat tunic

Grey socks (long or short), or grey tights

Alternatively, a "summer" dress* with plain white socks (long or short)



Sports Clothing List

School games top* (winter) and school white cricket shirt* (summer)

School black shorts* or skort*

School black socks* (winter) and plain white socks* (summer)

School black midlayer*

School black tracksuit bottoms* (optional) and white cricket trousers* (optional)









Other Sports Items

Pupils should wear trainers for PE and Games (velcro or laced) and, as they become more involved in hockey, may want separate astro-turf trainers. Football boots are required for those playing football and rugby.

Pupils need a mouth guard (self-moulding from MR Cricket Hockey or dental moulded are available) for rugby and hockey, and shin pads for hockey and football. These are essential for safe participation. A boot bag* is optional but useful for football boots.

Other Items

A cricket sun hat* or baseball cap* or bobble hat* with the School logo are the recommended headwear.

Outdoor coats can be any colour. Children should have a backpack* with the School logo on. Shoes must be black, of a conventional design and polishable. They can be laced up or velcro but should not be trainer-type shoes or boots. Any heel should be low-heeled. For safety reasons no open toe shoes or sandals are allowed.








